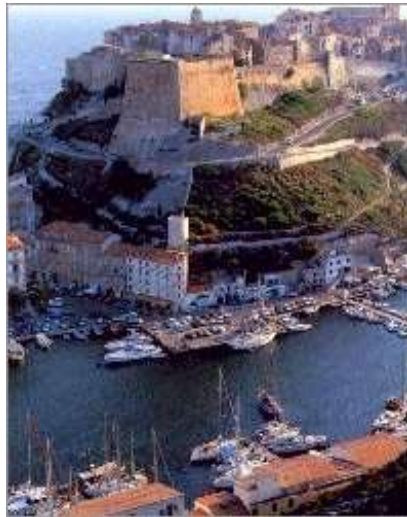

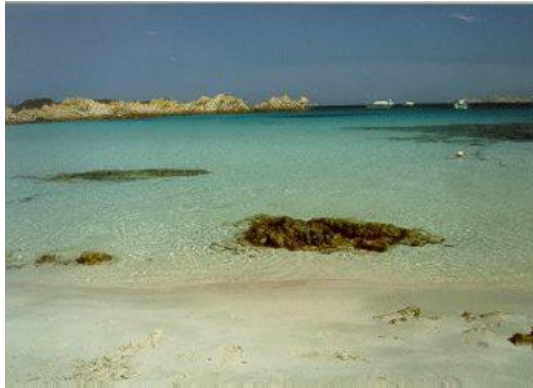

We suggest first a trip to Porto Cervo, the famous millionaire's playground of the Costa Smeralda that was created by a syndicate headed by the Agha Khan, it is highly fashionable, beautifully planned and full of top class shopping. There after dinner at the famous Cala di Volpe restaurant.

**Day 5**

**Ponza**



Journey time 13 hrs approx.

Ponza has a long and fascinating history dating back to pre-Roman times. It has beautiful beaches, interesting geography and ancient ruins. The island has few foreign visitors and so has managed to remain almost exclusively the haunt of Italians. Around 20 miles long by three miles wide, it is the largest of the six islands in the Pontine Archipelago, a string of volcanic crags sprinkled across the Tyrrhenian Sea, 23 miles off the coast of Lazio.

In the morning we can anchor off the coast full of crags and hidden coves for exploring.

In the evening we will drop anchor near Ponza Town, which curls around the harbour. Moorish-looking cubed houses in faded raspberry pink and lemon rise steeply from the waterfront forming an amphitheatre around the bay. The harbour is connected to the main promenade above by a series of staircases, while a tangle of tiny streets continue up the hill.

Day 6

## Capri



Journey time 6 hours approx.

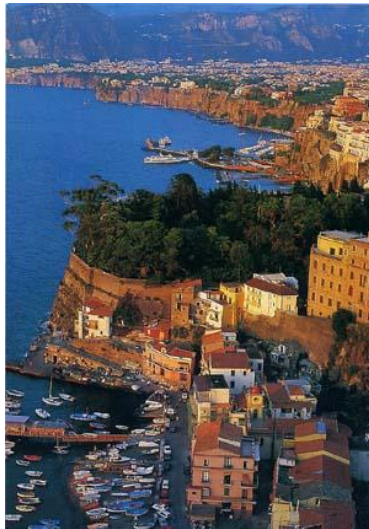
When you wake up the Captain will raise the anchor and cruise across to Capri.

There will then be time to visit the cute shopping town of Capri, including the S. Giacomo Carthusian Monastery. In the evenings you can either dine on board or seek out the legendry restaurant La Capannina for an unforgettable dinner ashore or perhaps L'Olivio, the Michelin starred restaurant.

**Day 7**

**Sorrento/Positano**

Journey time 2 hours approx.

ETA Sorrento 07:00 hrs

Should you not wish to visit Pompeii will go straight to Positano.

Wake up off the coast of Sorrento. We will organise transfers to take you to the fascinating ruins of Pompeii. Well preserved in ash and lava after an eruption of Mount Vesuvio in AD 79. Pompeii offers the best insight anywhere to what life in a big city must have been like 2000 years ago.

On your return enjoy a stroll through the surprisingly pleasant old town of Sorrento. This gateway to the Amalfi coast has an unspoiled old quarter, a lively main shopping street with a spectacular cliff side setting. Perhaps lunch can be organised at the three Michelin star Don Alfonso, Sant'Agata sui Due Golfi.

Once everyone is back on board we will cruise to Positano for dinner. Now the problem is there are too many places to choose from!!! Penne with prawns and arugula at La Cambusa overlooking the beach. Hundreds of candles, the prettiest terrace and gourmet treats at La Sponda, Le Sirenuse Hotel. For those slow food aficionados, why not head for the eagle's nest at Il Ritrovo, Montepertuso. The choice is yours.
